2004 G.A.M. Shiraz

“...the 2004 Shiraz G.A.M. is an exceptional example of a precise yet full-flavored, concentrated Shiraz. Unbelievably lush and almost sweet, with mouthfilling, liqueur-like dark berry and ripe plum flavours tinged by intriguing notes of charred herbs and anise. Finishes with excellent persistence of dark berry fruit.”
